The original designs of these prints were sent by the Emperor of China to be engraved in France. When

they were done, the plates were sent to China, and very few impressions remained in Europe.

This volume is printed in most beautiful Gothic characters on 267 leaves in two columns, and is supposed to have been executed at Strasburg, or in the Carthusian monastery at Strasburg: it begins,

Excerpta ex dictis Sanctorum Doctorum de diversis defectibus & negligentis nec non dubiis casibus qui committi et contingere possunt in missa —
