A PAIR OF CARVED RED LACQUER PEACH-FORM BOXES AND COVERS
18TH/19TH CENTURY

Each carved on top with a very similar scene of three scholars conversing in a landscape, flanked by an attendant on one side and a fisherman in his boat on the other, all within a foliate and paired peach border, the sides carved with large lotus and leaf sprays, all reserved on a diaper ground; *together with* a red lacquer circular box and cover, 18th/19th century, well carved with an immortal flying a kite while balancing atop a toppled vase carried atop wind-blown waves, encircled by a foliate border above diaper-carved sides 11½ and 6½in. (29.2 and 16.5cm.) across (3)

Each with a central procession scene showing some figures bearing gifts approaching the walls of a palace compound, the sides with panels of flowering peony and prunus boughs, all reserved on finely patterned diaper grounds, the interiors lacquered black 14½in. (37.8cm.) diam. (2)

A CARVED RED, BLACK AND BROWN LACQUER RECTANGULAR PANEL
QIANLONG

Well carved with the victorious army of General Agui marching through the mountains of Sichuan and destroying stone forts of the rebel forces, beneath a long inscription describing the campaign, all within a frame carved with dragons contesting flaming pearls amidst clouds, the reverse painted in gold and red with auspicious emblems and bats amidst clouds on a black lacquer ground 24½in. x 39¾in. (62.5 x 100cm.)

A similar panel is illustrated by D. Clifford, *Chinese Carved Lacquer*, London, 1992, p. 125, pl. 99, and the author notes that the panel shows the campaign of General Agui, sent in 1771 to suppress an uprising in the mountains of Sichuan. After the rebels surrendered in 1776 the general was greeted by the Qianlong Emperor upon his return to Beijing.
