

Cochin, Charles Nicolas. [Suite de seize estampes représentant les conquêtes de l'Empereur de la Chine]. [Paris:1775.] Broadsheets.

QianLong (K'ien Lung) (1710-1798) became Emperor of China in 1735 and abdicated in 1795, two years after receiving the embassy of Lord Macartney. Of a warlike disposition, he waged war on his neighbours, including the Gurkhas of Nepal, and greatly extended Chinese territories, particularly in Turkestan. This suite of plates is a record of the campaigns waged in the 1750s against the 'Eleuths', i.e. Tatar Kalmucks, and certain rebels, as is a substantial body of poetry from his pen.

The emperor commanded by an imperial decree dated 13 July 1765 that designs telling of his victories should be engraved in Europe by the best artists and engravers, and that four specified plates should be sent to Europe to be engraved in 100 copies which should be sent to him together with the plates: the remaining 12 would then be sent on later; payment in full was to be made. The drawings were sent from China through the French Compagnie des Indes to be engraved in France (in the teeth of the English East India Company, which badly wanted to get the order) largely because of Attiret's ascendancy at court. The first four designs arrived in autumn 1766 and at the end of the year the Marquis de Marigny was contacted by the Compagnie des Indes, and it was through him that the work on the engravings was put in hand. The remaining twelve designs arrived in July 1767.

The drawings for the plates were made by a number of missionaries, the Jesuits Denis Attiret from Dôle (1702-1768), Ignatius Sichelbarth a Czech (1708-1780), and Giuseppe Castiglione originally from Milan (1688-1766), and the discalced Augustinian John Damascene a Sanctissima Conceptione, a Roman by name Sallusti, who became Bishop of Peking in 1778. The engraving was executed, as all the plates attest, under the direction of Cochin fils, and the plates engraved by Le Bas and his pupils between 1767 and 1774. The finished plates were sent at various times, as and when, to China. However it is clear that pulls from the plates were made for 'special persons' like Marigny, and this explains why copies of the original plates are found in European collections.

In 1785 the engraver Helman published a reduction of the plates 'dans un format commode pour les amateurs et plus convenable aux bibliothèques' with the title 'Suite de seize estampes représentant les conquêtes de l'Empereur de la Chine' and the imprint: *Paris: chez l'auteur et chez M. Ponce... Rue St. Hyacinthe Maison de Mr. Debure à côté du Fourreur*. This title, together with the captions or legends for the plates, all engraved on one sheet 363 x 417mm., is present in this copy, and the title given above is taken from it. Equally it is in the order as given by Helman that the plates are bound, whereas Pelliot gives a different order as correct (8, 5, 9, 4, 2, 13, 3, 7, 4, 10, 15, 12, 11, 1, 6, 16), stating that Helman's legends 'étaient réparties de manière fantaisiste'. Pelliot gives titles based on Chinese poems by QianLong, which relate to the events depicted.

The illustration in GrO shows also a presentation inscription on the verso of a plate giving it to Prevost the engraver. This is not present on any of the plates in this copy, which have been regarded and the volume resewn.

An important work, here published in a second, enlarged edition (the first appeared in 1751), which grew out of the trip to made to Italy in 1749-1751 in the retinue of Madame de Pompadour's brother Abel-François de Vandières, later marquis de Marigny, to whom the work is dedicated. This journey is often seen 'as marking the beginning of the official reaction against the rococo style' (J. Fleming, *Robert Adam and his Circle*, London, 1962, p. 343), and as regards Cochin himself, there was a transformation: 'ces deux ans de voyage jouent en effet un rôle capital dans l'évolution de la pensée et de l'art de Cochin' (Michel op. cit p. 77). The *Recueil* is a collection edited by Cochin.
